Q: HOW IS IT THAT CAPITAL ONE CURRENT AND FORMER EMPLOYEES DO NOT HAVE TO PAY TO ATTEND?

A. The City of Salinas is providing fee support using funds provided by Capital One for certain approved retraining activities. These funds can be utilized before or after a person has left Capital One.
